




## Aboriginal health


# Voices of Aboriginal people

- Housing an issue of major concern to community
- Poor dwelling conditions
- Insufficient space for family size
- Issues with affordability, instability and homelessness
- Key determinant of health and wellbeing
- Discrimination in the private rental system
- Difficulty navigating the social housing system

### Beyond the medical: Child Health Forum Integrating services to better help people and communities "Keeping our kids safe"

#### Healthcare workers:

- No established and effective care pathway to connect housing, health and social service agencies with Aboriginal families in South East Sydney;
- No clear communication pathway between services.

# Governance structure

#### Aboriginal Reference Group - Includes Aboriginal health workers and Aboriginal people in the community

#### Project group - Made up of all project group members (23 people in South East and South West Sydney, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Aboriginal researchers, health workers and social service provider staff) - Bimonthly meetings and asneeded workshops


Core operational group - Made up of several project group members leading core operations e.g. ethics, project timeframe - Fortnightly meetings & regular e-mails

# Stakeholder interviews

- Time taken supporting housing tenants
- Housing issues mould, pests, unsuitable housing, security, structural, unsafe neighbourhoods, violence
- Transparency process to support clients/patients
- Housing provider accountability
- Escalation
- Partnerships and relationships between agencies
- Under resourcing of social services and housing agencies






