It is our pleasure to present the Strategic Plan 2022-2027 for the Australian Housing and Urban Research Institute.



These challenges also sharpen the need for reliable, rigorous and independent evidence to inform decision making by governments and industry.

In this context, the role of AHURI is crucial, as the only organisation in Australia dedicated exclusively to housing, homelessness, cities and related urban research.

The Institute works with a diverse range of stakeholders—our Strategic Plan incorporates strategies and objectives that reflect the diversity of needs of our partners. The plan has been developed collaboratively with staff and representatives of Australian government, state and territory governments, universities, community services and private sectors.

Through this process we have confirmed the Institute's vision and mission, which will determine what we are working to achieve and how we will work to achieve it. This plan sets out our direction for the next five years. Our annual operational plans will be developed to advance our strategic goals and deliver on our mission.

National Cities Research Program


