




Kāinga Ora is focused on delivering quality urban developments that connect homes with jobs, transport, open spaces and the facilities that communities need.



Case Study – Deconstruction

Building opportunity through waste

- Deconstructed material gets a second lease of life through re use.
- Ensuring there is a market for reused materials can be challenging, but our deconstruction contractor TROW Group has come up with an innovative solution.
- Materials from Kāinga Ora homes, and other projects, are shipped to Tonga to be repurposed, donated and assist with skills training

Case Study – Partnership Initiatives

Greenway Salvage Day 2022

- Kāinga Ora's deconstruction partner, Greenway held a community salvage day – 150 people attended
- A wide assortment of salvaged materials were on offer, including ovens, heat pumps, curtains, insulation, tap wear and stainless steel benches
- Given away was:
 400-600 sqm of insulation
 Enough curtains to furnish 2 averaged sized houses
 15 kitchenettes and about 18 ovens and heaters
- Greenway and Kāinga Ora will be involved in more community events like this in the future


