The Queensland Government received **\$398.3M** under the Social Housing Accelerator Plan for additional homes.

Improving integration between housing and planning

The legislation will make it easier to:

- acquire land or create an easement for development of infrastructure
- create an alternate development assessment pathway to deliver priority development
- allow local governments to place land in a holding pattern until the land use and infrastructure planning has been completed.

It also eases the bureaucratic issues raised by stakeholders including:

- streamlining the Minister's direction power process for local planning schemes
- enabling development to not require development approval for a temporary period
- and reducing the regulatory burdens for state and local governments.

These tools can be used in any growth area across Queensland, allowing for an agile response to growth pressures both in Brisbane and in regional areas.
